MINNESOTA'S KEY INDUSTRIES

ADVANCED MANUFACTURING

The backbone of the state's economy — Minnesota's diverse, technology-driven advanced manufacturing sector — is particularly strong in high-tech manufacturing, including computers and electronics, medical devices, and vehicles.

CLEAN TECH & RENEWABLE ENERGY

Minnesota ranks among the top states for environmentally friendly and sustainable business practices and has thriving companies in a broad range of clean technology and renewable energy clusters, including biofuels, water technology, and wind and solar power. As the first state to mandate the use of biofuels in 2005, Minnesota has seen carbon emissions from the power sector decline by 40% in the last 10 years and 10% in the previous year alone.

FOOD PRODUCTION & AGRICULTURE

Minnesota is a food production and agricultural powerhouse. The state ranks **fourth in the nation in the total value of crops** and **fourth in agricultural exports**, making it one of the top producers of food in the country. Not surprisingly, Minnesota is home to global leaders in agriculture food production and distribution, including the nation's largest privately held company, Cargill.
